### 3. Dormitories and corridors

# 4. Security

Leaders must ensure the premises are secured during their stay; all doors and windows to be checked each night.

- Required level of provision for first aid: All visiting groups to bring own first aid essentials.
- Supervision Arrangements: all young people under the age of 18 to be supervised by a suitably qualified adult with current DBS certificate.
- A minimum ratio of 1 Leader to 10 children is required between ages of 10–18.
- Under 10 years:1 leader to 5.
- Groups are informed they are responsible for good housekeeping whilst staying in the Hostel.
- Where necessary, individual risk assessments must be carried out by the organisation prior to the individual attending.
- Any external activity must be Risk Assessed by the organisation.
